PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It was a great start to the season when were able to return to an upgraded De Winton Par. The upgrade work was completed during season 2020/21 whilst we were relocated to Banyule Flats. Work included renovations to the clubroom resulting in upgrades to toilets in both the clubrooms and the change rooms to ensure change rooms are female friendly, a meeting room, additional storage rooms. The veranda was also extended – almost doubled in size – which provides significantly more shade.

Continuing Covid lockdowns and the uncertainty surrounding the season start time, planning for the season was again difficult with many meetings, including the AGM, being held virtually. Pre-season training was again problematic but credit to Huss and his coaching team that training was both well organised and well attended. The season again started six weeks later than usual and remained as one day games in all grades.

The effort of the committee, coaches and players to be ready for the season is to be commended Covid based restrictions were again placed on training and match days, whilst not as stringent as the previous season were still in place – Matt Macaulay again took on the role of Covid-Safe Officer for the club – thank you Matt.

On field our results were varied with the 2nds and 5ths making their Grand Finals – the fifths winning comfortably and the seconds having a heartbreaking loss. The 1st XI and the 3Rd XI both had what I would call an almost season. Special thanks to Mark Prince for volunteering to score for the 1sts every week.

Unfortunately, Adam Crosthwaite was unable to continue his role with the T20 team due to schedule conflict with Premier crickets' T20 programme. Whilst we competed well and finished 2nd in our group this was not enough to advance to the finals.

With Neil Crosthwaite stepping down from the senior coaching role the club advertised for a replacement however received little interest from outside the club – Huss volunteered to take on the role for the season and did an outstanding job coaching in difficult circumstances. Neil continued in a specialist batting role. The work done by our two net captains needs to be commended – "Gus" Logan and "DK" Leonard did a great job and enabled Huss to coach rather than coordinate. Thanks to all of you for your contribution.

The work done by the committee was again outstanding. With Chris Payne stepping down from the Secretary position as well as Huss from Vice President, it was great to see Ollie Toussaint and Nick Horsford take on these respective roles – both did a great job – the club is in good hands for the future. We continue to be very fortunate to have Gary Bryant as treasurer.

The club remains in a very strong financial position as outlined in the Treasurers report in needs to be noted that a significant investments have been made to benefit both the playing group – portable net for centre wicket practice, Frogbox and during the off season a second bowling machine for use in the outdoor nets (with assistance for a successful grant application) and off field with Square technology which makes life easier for volunteers in the bar/canteen and for Gary. We are currently working with the Macleod Football club and are hoping to have an electronic scoreboard commissioned later this year.

Eamon and Ruth Bourke have continued to be passionate and committed Junior Coordinators who work tirelessly to ensure the ongoing success of our junior programme however after five years in the role have chosen to step aside – thank you both for what has been a significant commitment and contribution to the club. It was great to see the club field a stand-alone under 18 team for the first time – thanks to Pat Bourke and Riley O'Sullivan who "coached" this team to the grand final.

Whilst there was limited opportunity to hold social events the events that were held were again very well supported. Unfortunately, we were not able to hold the \$2k draw – this will now be scheduled for early in season 2022/2023. The work done to support the Toyota Good for Cricket raffle by Matt (Swanny) Jackson and others was superb raising in the vicinity of \$2,800.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Despite ongoing challenges, this season was solid financially. The club posted a profit of \$1,780.64 for the financial year, with the net asset position increasing from \$49,005.55 to \$49,727.77.

The main financial performance trends were:

- Fundraising opportunities were fewer than we would have liked. The Toyota Good for Cricket Raffle raised ~\$2800, well down on last season we need a big push for this next season as it is the easiest fund raiser we have. Due to logistical difficulties, we could not run the \$2k draw which will return bigger and better next season. Thanks to the whole RCC community for their support through the smaller fundraising initiatives during the season.
- Sponsorships have started to rebound after dropping significantly during COVID. Thanks to Eamon and Ruth (Viewbank early childhood centre) for their continued support as our Premium sponsor. We also welcome Kate Thwaites as a Gold sponsor, joining long standing sponsors LA Flooring (Luke Anderson) and TS Finance (Tim Sheehan). We also think our Bronze sponsors, the Harp of Erin, Café Matto and The Phantom. Hopefully we will be able to again engage with past and new sponsors in the upcoming season. The coterie group (Rosanna Legends) was again a success, though slightly down on last season.
- Council generosity in waiving ground and pavilion fees during COVID did not apply this season, though they did decide to reduce costs by 50% at the end of the season (after fees were paid). So we will start next seasons with a credit which will cover approximately 50% of next year's ground fees. We also received a final government grant for COVID support, for which the club is very grateful.
- A big win is that the new solar panels installed while we were at Banyule Flats have paid dividends our electricity costs were zero this season. This will save approximately four thousand dollars per year going forward.
- As COVID was still a major issue, it was decided to keep subs at the COVID levels this season. Keeping this in mind, subscriptions were strong for both seniors and juniors.
- Bar & canteen profit were particularly strong, thanks to an almost full season, two teams in finals, and hosting the Money Shield final, which itself provided around \$3000 profit.
- We continued to make significant investments in infrastructure at De Winton Park, including Frogbox, iPads for scoring, and the new Square payment system for the canteen and bar, all of which were very successful, and make life easier for the volunteers around the club.

JUNIOR MANAGER'S REPORT

Season 2021 / 2022 saw the club field three junior sides – U18's, U16's and U 14's. Efforts to establish a U'10 and a U'12 side were unsuccessful mainly due to lockdown and our incapacity to hold pre-season training / promotion events. Attempts to establish a girl's side with Lower Plenty CC also fell through. Our Junior Blasters program saw 17 children enrolled with the weekly activities returning to De Winton after a year at Banyule Flats.

Numbers were well down with a full team of players withdrawing from the club in the week leading up to the first game. However, 'quality' is a theme amongst our juniors with the 14's and 18's both making grand finals and our 16's having several outstanding representative players.

An offseason restructure saw us split the juniors into two groups:

• Group A: Blasters / 10's and 12's

• Group B: 14's, 16's and 18's

Furthermore, attempts to establish a Junior Committee to spread the workload were unsuccessful mainly due to the impact of Covid19 on people and their lives.

Our U14 squad was coached by Eamon Bourke and for the second year running made the Grand Final. After starting in Red (third division) they were promoted to Teal (second division) after round 3. A squad of 14 players lost only two games on the way to the grand final by 1 run but came up short in the big one at De Winton. A number of players were in representative teams and played for our seniors with two playing in our 5th's premiership. This group has consistently played outstanding cricket across the last two years and has a number of highly talented prospects.

The U16's were once again coached by Geoff Wilson. A squad of 13 was placed in Blue (1st division) where they won three games finishing 7th with a number of players experiencing this level of cricket for the first time. Despite the difficult year all players acquitted themselves admirably and will benefit greatly from being exposed to a high level of cricket. Leo Dench and Idhant Yarlagadda both made over 200 runs and along with Siena Ferrara were all representative players.

The U18 squad was coached by Patrick Bourke. The squad consisted of 13 players in Teal (second division) and finished the regular season third. A terrific finals series saw them make the Grand Final where they were unable to overcome a stronger opponent who had the wood on them all season. Thomas Bourke made over 200 runs and was a representative player along with Jacob Janezic their leading wicket taker.
