In many respects, the Club is analogous to the history of the ‘District of Heidelberg’


In the last 100 years, we have:

- Moved from “rural” to “suburbia”
- Seen significant “demographic” and “social” change
- Seen businesses and sporting Clubs thrive and wither

Through sheer hard work and generations of great leadership, the Rosanna Cricket Club has survived those 100 years

It is an incredibly proud of the contribution that it has made to the local sporting community as evidenced by the fact that since 1925:

- 1,500 players have represented the Club at the senior level
- Similar number having played in our junior sides since 1960



Our Ethos

- To play hard, but fairly
- To respect the ‘Laws of the Game’ and be respected by the opposition
- To be part of a cricketing family and, of course, to win premierships!



Era 1925 to 1949

The Club was formed on the 12th August 1925

First President, local Dentist, Dr John Mills

Season 1925-26

- First season in the Heidelberg District Cricket Association (HDCA)
- Competing Clubs were Alphington, Fairfield, Fairfield Diggers, Fairfield Footballers, Heidelberg, Ivanhoe, North Ivanhoe and Rosanna
- Home Ground Heidelberg Park (Warringal Parklands)

Season 1927-28

- Club moved to Rosanna Reserve – renamed De Winton Park in 1930

Season 1932-33. 2nd X1 side entered



Season 1939-40. The Club Won its first Premiership (1st X1)

World War 2:

- 1941-42. Only 1st X1 entered for competition
- Competition was suspended for 3 seasons between 1942 and 1945
- Reformed for Season 1945-46; Only one Grade of competition
- Season 1946-47. 2nd X1 entered

1947-48. The 1st X1 won its second 1st Grade premiership


1948. Life Membership Awards Introduced



Era 1950 to 1974

Golden Era

- Post WW2, Rosanna experienced a significant growth in population with many new families moving into the area
- An additional three senior X1's were progressively introduced between 1961 and 1970 to cater for increased player numbers
- Season 1960-61. HDCA establishes a Junior Grade competition for players Under 16 years of age. The competition was expanded in Season 1971-72 to include an Under 14 grade



- Off the field, the Club was led by several outstanding administrators. Three standouts were:
 - Bill Luby. President from 1959-60 to 1969-70
 - Brian Carlton. Club Secretary from 1954-55 to 1963-64
 - Barney Luby. Social Secretary extraordinaire for 35 years
 - All three gentlemen left an indelible mark on how a community sporting Club should be run!
- On the field, the Club enjoyed extraordinary success. It finished the era having won 25 Senior and 6 Junior Grade premierships:
 - 1st X1 Won 11 Premierships; Runners Up 7 times
 - **1st X1 Played in 11 consecutive Grand Finals between 1954-55 & 1964-65 (Won 6, Lost 5)**
 - 2nd X1 Won 8 Premierships; Runners Up 3 times
 - 3rd X1 & 4th X1's both won 3 Premierships



- Other highlights:

- Season 1961-62. Triple Premiership. 1st X1, 2nd X1 & 3rd X1.

First time that this feat had been achieved in HDCA history!

- Season 1966-67. The Club won its first Junior Premiership
 - Season 1969-70. The Club claims its second Triple Premiership. 1st X1, 2nd X1 & 4th X1




Era 1975 to 1999

Part 1 – Crisis Management

The early/mid 70's saw a changing of the guard. Many long-standing Club administrators and a substantial number of players from the previous era had retired.

Despite a good flow of former juniors coming through our lower X1's, our on-field success had waned. And, in the blink of an eye, the Club faced a crisis.

Prior to the commencement of the 1976-77 season, a disgruntled group of approximately 25 younger players quit the Club. The loss of so many players led to a dramatic fall in performances with 3 of our 4 Senior X1's finishing last on the ladder at seasons end.



In a further fall from grace, our 1st X1 was relegated to 2nd Grade for the 1977-78 Season. This was due to the HDCA having a relegation/promotion system in place

This meant, for the first time in 50 or so years, that the Club would not be playing in the 1st Grade in the HDCA!

Devastated, but not deterred, the Club rolled up its sleeves and re-structured its operations with a single focus of re-claiming its mantle as the “Premier Club” in the HDCA



Actions taken included:

- Modernising its administrative structure with the adoption of a new Constitution and a streamlined Committee
- Appointment of a senior Coach
- Devoting more resources to our Junior program

Results were immediate:

- Our 1st X1 won the 2nd Grade premiership - thereby being reinstated to the HDCA's 1st Grade competition for Season 1978-79
- Our Under 16 side was also victorious winning our 7th premiership at that level of competition.



Era 1975 to 1999

Part 2 – Challenges with our Junior Program

By the early 80's, our Junior program had become the “lifeblood” of the Club.

**** The program was critical to providing the next wave of senior players and future leaders. Without it, the Club would not continue to develop and remain successful ****

Whilst the Club thought it had a good ‘handle’ on this issue, things turned pear-shaped quickly. Between Seasons 1989 and 1992 the Club was unable to field any Junior sides



The crux of the issue was two-fold:

- Not having enough parents and senior players to manage and coach the boys throughout the week and on match days
- Cricket was also facing challenges from other sporting codes such as Tennis, Basketball and Little Athletics

Realising how important the Juniors were to its existence, the Club embarked on a sustained recruitment drive in the local area

Thanks to the hard work of a re-invigorated Committee, several devoted parents and senior Club players, the program was reinstated with an Under 14 side being formed for Season 1992-93



Within two seasons, our numbers had increased and we had sides entered in all age Groups – Under 12, 14 and 16

Over the next 8 seasons, the boys were successful in winning 12 premierships and were runners-up 5 times

Importantly, many of this cohort went onto to become Senior Grade premiership players with some going on to hold senior Committee positions

Seven have since been elected Club Life Members with our current President, Luke Anderson, being a ‘graduate’ from the Under 14 side of 1992-23



Era 1975 to 1999

Part 3 – Honouring our Club Greats

- 1981. W P (Bill) Luby Memorial Award introduced. An annual award, it acknowledges and recognises a member who makes an “over and above” contribution to the Club during that season
- 1983. Hall of Fame introduced – acknowledging Milestones in Games played, Runs made, Wickets taken and Fielding dismissals. These records are updated annually
- 1991. Barney Luby Club Champion Award introduced. Awarded at the conclusion of each season. Recognises the player who accrues the greatest number of All-Rounder points across all Senior Grades



Season 1998-99

- 1st X1 Batting, Bowling, All-Rounder and Fielding Trophies named after Club playing greats – Dick Russell, Steve Durant, Ron Webster and Brian Carlton
- Senior Grade Aggregated Wicket Keepers Award introduced. Named after Club legend Denis Groom, the award recognises the leading wicket keeper each season based on the number of dismissals across all senior Grades

Finished the era with 13 Senior and 22 Junior Grade Premierships



Era 2000 to 2024

Another era of challenges ...

The Club joins the Diamond Valley Cricket Association
Celebrate our 100th Birthday

2001

- Banyule Council approved funding of \$450,000 to demolish and rebuild the De Winton Park Pavillion and refurbish the adjoining social rooms. The Club and its co-tenants (Macleod Rosanna Football Club) contributed over \$50,000 to the project
- Concerns raised about the viability and long-term future of the HDCA



Season 2002-03

De Winton Park unavailable due to above building works. 1st & 2nd X1 relocated to Elder Street Reserve (Watsonia).

Impacts finances and social calendar

2003

- Brian Carlton and John McKenzie presented with Commonwealth Community Sports Awards by the Federal Member for Jaga Jaga, Ms Jenny Macklin MP. The Awards were presented in recognition of their long and distinguished service to the Rosanna Cricket Club and overall contribution to community sport
- Cricket Victoria establishes My Cricket Website. Electronic scoring introduced

Season 2008-09

De Winton Park again unavailable due to levelling and re-sewing of the playing surface. 1st & 2nd X1 relocated to Ford Park (Bellfield). Finances are again impacted

2009

Veterans X1 for players “Over 40’s” formed. Won back-to-back premierships in its first two seasons

2011

Team of the Decade for 2001 to 2010 announced



2012

HDCA disbanded.

Rosanna makes the decision to join the Diamond Valley Cricket Association (DVCA) along with neighbouring Clubs Heidelberg and Banyule. Other local Clubs, Greensborough and Macleod, had left the HDCA a few seasons earlier

Season 2012-13

Our first season in the DVCA:

- 1st X1 won the DVCA Money Shield
- Club claimed its **third** Triple Premiership (1st X1, 2nd X1 & 4th X1)
- **First ever 3-Peat Premiership win by our 1st X1**
(Having won back-to-back 1st Grade premierships in the final two seasons of the HDCA 1st Grade competition)



Season 2012-13

Geoff Wilson Medal Award introduced. Named in honour of modern-day Club great, it is awarded each year to the “Most Valuable Player” as voted upon by the Senior X1 Captains at the conclusion of each Round

Season 2014-15

Denis Groom becomes the first player to play 500 senior games

2020 – 2022. Two major challenges:

Covid Pandemic

- Match-day and training protocols
- Revised playing conditions
- Impact on Social calendar and fund raising



(Another) redevelopment of De Winton Park .. and further disruption ...

- Over \$1M in funds provided by State Gov't and Council to upgrade the playing service and practice facilities at De Winton Park
- Pavillion - new toilets and changerooms built to ensure that they were female friendly
- Car park finally sealed!
- 1st & 2nd X1 relocated to Banyule Flats Reserve during the redevelopment
- Finances and social calendar again impacted



2022

- Life Members Alan Bell and John McKenzie, recognised by Cricket Victoria for their 50 years of service to cricket
- Team of the Decade for period 2011 to 2020 announced

Season 2022-23

- Geoff Wilson became only the second player to reach the 500 games milestone
- My Cricket portal replaced by Play Cricket
- **The Club won its first Barclay Shield - the highest level of competition in the DVCA**



Season 2024-25

- 100th Year
- Launch of 100 Not Out – a 3 Volume publication on The Centennial History of the Rosanna Cricket Club
- **Club won its 100th premiership (DVCA T20 Competition). Our 100th flag in our 100th year!**
- 1st X1 wins the Barclay Shield – its second in 3 seasons!
- Gala celebration at Heidelberg Golf Club – 160 attendees
- Upgraded Website

Finished the era with 21 Senior Grade and 12 Junior premierships.

Andrew Wildsmith

- An elegant left-handed batsman and more than capable bowler
- Debuted with our Under 16 side in Season 1970-71 as a 12-year-old
- Played in 4th X1 Premiership side that year
- Played in 4 consecutive Under 16 premiership sides between 1970-71 & 1973-74
- Captained the Under 16 premiership sides in 1972-73 & 1973-74
- After juniors, played District Cricket for Northcote
- Played 2 games for Victoria in Season 1983-84
- Won the coveted Jack Ryder Medal for the best player in District Cricket in Season 1984-85



Mick Lewis:

- Joined the Club in Season 1992-93 as an 18-year-old
- Played 60 games over 6 Seasons between 1992-93 & 1996-97
- A ‘tear away’ fast bowler, he took 209 wickets @ 15.11 – including a Hat Trick & a Double Hat Trick
- Moved to District Club, Northcote, in 1997-98
- Made his First-Class debut for Victoria in 1999-00
- Played 82 x First Class Matches & represented Australia in 8 x One Day Games and 2 x T20 Internationals



Adam Crosthwaite:

- Joined the Club in Season 1995-96 as an 11-year-old. Appointed Captain of our Under 12 side that Season
- A wicket keeper and hard-hitting middle order batsman, Adam showed outstanding leadership qualities and discipline for such a young person
- Played in the Under 14 premiership side in 1997-98
- In total, he played 30 junior & 23 senior games with the Club before moving to District Club, Richmond, in 2000
- Made his First-Class debut for Victoria in 2002-03
- Played 31 x First Class Matches & 26 x T20's games for Victoria, NSW and SA
- 2002. Represented Australia in Under 19 World Cup Championship competition
